Phonics and Reading

Evidence suggests that children read more if they have a love of books and a shared interest in books alongside their peers. Therefore, we have re-vamped our books corners, ensured our books match the level of reading children are at, developed a wonderful Reading Nook in the main corridor, created Top 5 and 10's of books and increased the opportunities for children to explore quality books and literature. This will work alongside our developments in phonics and comprehension. Language and reading are integrally linked – the more you can talk to your child in a meaningful way, the more they will broaden their language and understanding of the books they read. There will be many more opportunities to share in this work and we look forward to seeing the success in reading for our children.

This week we received out new Dyslexia Resources and we are in the process of putting them all together so that the children can be more ably supported in their learning. Parent Survey

Thank you for all those who contributed to the Parent Survey. I am pleased to say that the majority of parents are happy with education their children are receiving at the school and there were only a few areas for improvement. We have had a few teething problems with the allocation of reading books – in the main these have been sorted out but if you have concerns about your child's reading book, please speak to the class teacher in the first instance. An issue of play-ground management was raised regarding children being asked to wait against a wall when not behaving – this has been discussed with lunchtime staff and is not part of our general behaviour policy. Questions around the Report Cards and the reporting of progress has also been raised. I agree with the sentiment of the feedback and we are looking at how our assessment system supports a truer picture of your child's achievement. In addition to the Parent Survey, I also receive feedback from parents via email or over the phone. I am happy to hear your views and your feedback is always helpful. I know we cannot

please everyone all of the time but we genuinely do listen to your views and consider the best ways forward for your child and the school as a whole. If you ever feel you want to raise concerns or suggestions these can also be done through the Parent Forum where all parents are welcome to attend.

Pre-school and Wrap Around Care

Both the Pre school and Wrap Around Care are increasing in popularity. The atmosphere in both is warm and welcoming. If you would like a place for your child in either, please contact the school office.

Volunteering

Mrs Brennan put out a call for volunteer readers in school. A few parents have come forward but we are always looking for more. As volunteers, we do not place you into your child's class as this can cause a conflict of interest for all involved and can sometimes dysregulate a child in class. However, your support is widely welcomed in other areas of the school and we encourage you to participate to support all children's learning in school. If you would like to become a volunteer reader, please contact the school office and ask for Mrs Brennan.

If your child is ill then please let the office know. Holidays in term time will not be authorised. We can only authorise absence if your child is actually ill, not if they are kept off school as a precaution.
